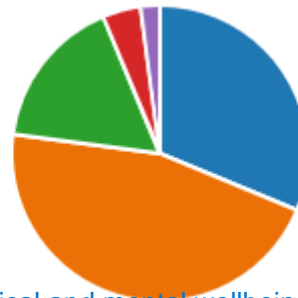

13. The school supports my child's wider personal development.

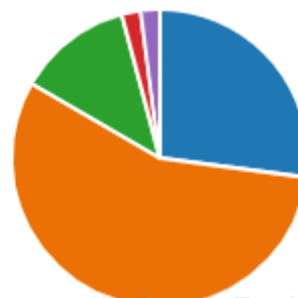
